with two home runs and seven runs-batted-in. The Cougars had seven players with 1.000 or better slugging percentages. The College of Charleston will pitch righty **Jake Goldberg** against the Chanticleers. Goldberg gave up six hits and one earned run in 1.2 innings this weekend. Goldberg also pitched against CCU last year in Mt. Pleasant, allowing five hits and three runs in 6.2 innings in a 6-5 Coastal win.

**SERIES VS. COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON:** Coastal enjoys an 11-7 series advantage and the Chants have won the last three meetings with the Cougars. Both games last year were won by one run. Coastal won 6-5 in 10 innings at CofC, while the Chants picked up an improbable 8-7 win at BB&T Coastal Field. **Dock Doyle** (Conway, S.C./Conway) drove in the game-winning run in a seven-run ninth inning.

**WEATHER FORECAST:** Chance of thunderstorms, high of 70 degrees.

**CHANTS STEALING BAGS:** After the first four games, Coastal has stolen 11 bases in 15 attempts. Freshman **Scott Woodward** (Markle, Ind./Norwell) leads the team with seven swipes in as many attempts. Last season, Coastal was 65-of-89 in stolen bases.

**WHAT A START FOR WOODWARD:** Freshman **Scott Woodward** (Markle, Ind./Norwell) had an impressive opening weekend to his career, hitting .500 (7-of-14) with six runs scored and three walks. He also did damage on the basepaths, stealing seven in as many attempts.

**A GRANNY FOR SAPP:** Junior **David Sappelt** (Saxapahaw, N.C./Southern Alamance) had three hits on the weekend in the IMICHotels.com INN-vitational, but none bigger than the grand slam he had in the sixth inning of the 10-4 win over Maryland. It was Sappelt's third career grand slam and it gave the Chants a 6-1 lead. Sappelt's other four run home runs came at Troy April 8, 2007 and at home against Liberty April 29.

**DOYLE DRIVES 'EM IN:** Redshirt junior **Dock Doyle** (Conway, S.C./Conway) drove in six runs on the weekend in the IMICHotels.com INN-vitational, including the game-winning single in the 10th inning as the Chants defeated Virginia Tech 4-3 Feb. 25. Doyle was 6-of-13 on the week with a double and a home run, while also throwing out two runners on the basepaths.

**FLEET RETURNS WITH A SOLID PERFORMANCE:** Redshirt sophomore **Austin Fleet** (Edmond, Okla./Santa Fe), who had not pitched since May of 2006 due to a torn labrum, came back in style in the 5-3 win over Maryland Feb. 24. Fleet threw 6.2 innings, allowing four hits and two runs while striking out three. The Terps hit just .167 off of Fleet, who moved his career record to 5-2.

**PITCHING STAFF SHOWS DEPTH:** Coastal had 11 pitchers toe the rubber for the IMICHotels.com INN-vitational. The Chants had a 2.68 earned-run average in the four games with four guys not allowing an earned run. Coastal's starters are 3-0, while senior **Joey Haug** (Holt, Mo./Maple Woods C.C.), junior **Jeff Richard** (West

**SEASON OPENER HISTORY:** Coastal moved to 21-12 in season openers in school history with its 10-4 win over Maryland Feb. 23. Coastal has won the last three season openers and now has started 4-0 the last two years.

**COASTAL IN THE POLLS:** Coastal Carolina is ranked in four preseason polls, the highest being 19th by Ping! Baseball. Coastal was 30th in the NCBWA poll, 37th in the *Collegiate Baseball* poll and 44th in the Perfect Game Crosschecker ranking. Coastal is receiving votes in the USA Today/Sports Weekly poll. Coastal moved up to 26th in the NCBWA poll Feb. 25.

**DRAFT DODGERS:** Coastal has five players on its roster that were taken in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Redshirt junior **Pete Andreliczyk** (Lancaster, Pa./Manheim Twp.) was taken by the Baltimore Orioles in the 32nd round of the 2007 draft. Redshirt junior **Dock Doyle** (Conway, S.C./Conway) was selected by the Atlanta Braves in the 44th round last season. Sophomore **Austin Fleet** (Edmond, Okla./Santa Fe) was taken in the 2006 draft by the Atlanta Braves and freshman **Chad Jenkins** (Newark, Del./Caravel Academy) was picked by the Washington Nationals in this past summer's draft. Sophomore **Jim Birmingham** (Pine Hill, N.J./Overbrook (Penn)) was taken by the Nationals in the 25th round in 2006.

**WATSON STADIUM/VROOMAN FIELD UNDERGOES CHANGES IN OFFSEASON:**

Fans entering Charles Watson Stadium/Vrooman Field for the home opener Feb. 22 against Maryland will notice a difference in the field and in the stands to the Chanticleer baseball home. Coastal has added chairback seats throughout the grandstand, replacing the bleachers that were in all but the first three rows of the concourse. Fans will have a better view of the game, as a new net on the backstop eliminated most of the poles between the fans and the field. Watson Stadium/Vrooman Field also has new Field Turf in foul territory in the infield and behind home plate. The home bullpen area also has new Field Turf. There also was a significant upgrade to the clubhouse, including new lockers and a new training room.

**WHO'S BACK:** Coastal returns five position starters and nine pitchers from last year's 50-13 team. Outfielders **David Sappelt** (Saxapahaw, N.C./Southern Alamance) and **Tommy Baldridge** (Fort Mill, S.C./Fort Mill) return along with shortstop **Tyler Bortnick** (Mentor, Ohio/Mentor), third baseman **Derek Martin** (Barnwell, S.C./Barnwell) and first baseman/designated hitter **David Anderson** (Lexington, S.C./White Knoll). Catcher **Dock Doyle** (Conway, S.C./Conway) also returns after starting 37 games behind the plate last season. Junior Bobby Gagg (Hamburg, N.J./Walkkill) anchors a pitching staff that also returns Anderson and sophomore **Nick McCully** (Lakeland, Fla./Santa Fe Catholic) in the rotation.

The Coastal Carolina University baseball team has been unanimously voted the Big South Conference's preseason favorite, as voted by the League's Head Baseball Coaches and Sports Information Directors, it was announced today by the Conference office. In addition, junior **David Sappelt** (Saxapahaw, N.C./Southern Alamance) has been voted the Conference's Preseason Player of the Year while classmate **Bobby Gagg** (Hamburg, N.J./Walkill) was voted the Pre-season Pitcher of the Year.

Coastal received all 16 first-place votes and the maximum 128 points to win the Big South in 2008. Coastal returns 15 letterwinners from last year's 50-13 squad (17-4 in Big South play) that hosted the 2007 Myrtle Beach Regional. The Chanticleers enter the 2008 campaign ranked 19th in the preseason Ping! Baseball poll as well as 30th by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA), 37th by Collegiate Baseball and 44th in the Perfect Game Cross-checker preseason ranking.

VMI followed Coastal in the preseason poll, as the Keydets collected 97 points to edge out third-place Liberty by one point. Winthrop was picked fourth with 88 points, while High Point finished fifth in the voting with 61 points. UNC Asheville received 56 points for sixth place, while Charleston Southern and Radford tied for seventh place in the preseason poll with 25 points each.

along with 13 games against the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) in the 2008 schedule. Coastal will host Michigan for two games in the Centex Homes Invitational March 15-16. Michigan is ranked as high as eighth in the *Baseball America* poll. Coastal also has midweek games against North Carolina, Clemson, North Carolina State, Virginia and Wake Forest and has a three-game series at Georgia Tech May 2-4.

**MARTIN TO START FIFTH SEASON FOR**

**CHANTS:** Redshirt senior **Derek Martin** (Barnwell, S.C./Barnwell) starts his fifth and final season in a Coastal Carolina uniform. Martin has a career .271 batting average with 23 doubles, five home runs and 93 runs-batted-in in 162 games. Martin played only three games in 2005 due to injury, earning a redshirt. **Tommy Baldrige** (Fort Mill, S.C./Fort Mill) and **Joey Haug** (Holt, Mo./Plattsburg (Maple Woods C.C.)) are Coastal's other true seniors. Baldrige has a .358 career batting average with 17 home runs and 93 RBI, while Haug was 1-0 with a 3.66 earned-run average in his first season at Coastal in 2007.

**NEWCOMERS DOT COASTAL ROSTER:** Coastal has 14 newcomers on the roster, including 10 true freshman. Coastal has four transfers dotting the roster for the first time in 2008 - redshirt junior **Jeff Richard** (West Bloomfield, Mich./West Bloomfield (Central Michigan)), sophomore **Jose Iglesias** (Miami, Fla./G. Holmes Braddock (St. John's)), sophomore **Adam Rice** (Murphy, Texas/Kennedy (Elgin C.C.)) and sophomore **Jim Birmingham** (Pine Hill, N.J./Overbrook (Penn)). Freshman **Rich Witten** (Danville, Ky./Danville) is in the rotation for the first weekend, while classmate **Scott Woodward** (Markle, Ind./Norwell) is a probable starter in the outfield.

**COASTAL IN TOP-25 NATIONALLY IN WINNING PERCENTAGE (2001-07):** Coastal Carolina is tied for 12th in winning percentage in the last seven years. The Chanticleers have a 301-136 record, good for a .689 winning percentage. Rice leads the country with a .773 percentage. Coastal is above such schools as North Carolina, LSU and Miami in the list.

**COASTAL TO HOST FOUR IN-SEASON TOURNAMENTS:** The IMICHotels.com INN-vitational starts a string of four weekends in a row with a tournament hosted by the Chanticleers. The prestigious Baseball at the Beach Tournament is Feb. 29-March 2 and features CCU, Marshall, West Virginia, George Mason and Western Carolina at both Watson Stadium/Vrooman Field and BB&T Coastal Field.

**COASTAL TO VIDEO STREAM 23 GAMES:** The Coastal Carolina University baseball team will have 23 of its games at Watson Stadium/Vrooman Field video streamed on THE EDGE at [www.BigSouthSports.com](http://www.BigSouthSports.com) this season. The schedule begins with the season opener Feb. 22 against Maryland beginning at 4 p.m. Other highlights include eight of the nine home games against Big South opponents, two games against nationally-ranked Michigan March 15-16 and midweek contests versus Elon, the College of Charleston and Wake Forest. THE EDGE also will show every game of the 2008 Big South Baseball Tournament in Danville, Va.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS HIGHLIGHT EARLY HONOREES:** Coastal had three players named to at least one Preseason All-America list before the 2008 season. Senior **Tommy Baldrige** (Fort Mill, S.C./Fort Mill) was picked by Rivals.com as a First Team Preseason All-American. He also is a Second Team All-America by Louisville Slugger and by Ping! Baseball. Baldrige and junior **Bobby Gagg** (Hamburg, N.J./Wallkill) were named to the Wallace Award Watch List. Gagg also was a Second Team All-America by Louisville Slugger, Ping! Baseball and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA). Junior **David Sappelt** (Saxapahaw, N.C./Southern Alamance) was named a First Team All-Ping! Baseball member and was named to the Golden Spikes Award Watch List. He also was named to the Third Team by Louisville Slugger. Junior **David Anderson** (Lexington, S.C./White Knoll) was named to the 2008 Stopper of the Year Watch List.

**CHANTS PICKED TO WIN BIG SOUTH:** The websites SouthEastern Baseball.com and Rivals.com as well as the College Baseball Insider have all picked Coastal to win the Big South. The Chanticleers also are picked 10th in SEBaseball's Top 80 teams in the Southeast. Coastal was unanimously picked to win the Big South by the League's coaches and sports information directors.

**COASTAL HOSTS 2007 MYRTLE BEACH REGIONAL:** Coastal became the first Big South school to host a regional, as the Chanticleers were the number-one seed for the second time in three years. Coastal advanced to the regional championship game, falling to Clemson in the finale. The winner's bracket final on June 3 brought in 6,231 fans, a record at BB&T Coastal Field. **Dock Doyle, Dom Duggan** and **Bobby Gagg** were named to the All-Myrtle Beach Regional team.

**COASTAL WINS EIGHTH BIG SOUTH TOURNAMENT TITLE:** Coastal went unbeaten in the Big South Tournament, winning its eighth tournament title in school history. The Chanticleers won the title game 6-5 over Liberty as senior **Dom Duggan** hit the game-winning home run in the seventh inning. Coastal opened the tournament with a 6-3 win over UNC Asheville. The Chants defeated VMI 4-2 and Winthrop 13-4. Junior **Tommy Baldrige** was the tournament Most Valuable Player and he

teams have averaged over 39 wins a year, including 11 40-plus win seasons. In his 12 years at Coastal, Gilmore's ball clubs have finished in the top four of the Big South Conference standings 11 times, including regular season titles in 1999, 2002, 2005 and 2007. Coastal also was one of only seven schools in Division I to win 40+ games from 2001-05. He has coached 55 All-Big South Conference players and five Big South Players of the Year, including Sappelt in 2007. Ryan McGraw also broke the NCAA single-season stolen base mark with 63 in 2002.

Coastal Carolina head coach **Gary Gilmore**, who is entering his 13th season with the Chanticleers, has seen the program continually rise in the world of college baseball to a national power. Six NCAA berths, seven 40+ win seasons in the last nine years, 10-straight winning seasons, numerous draft picks with more to come and a stadium that will become one of the nicest in the country are just a part of the exciting things going on in Coastal Carolina baseball.

**GILMORE GRABS CAREER WIN #700 IN WIN OVER UNCA:** Coastal head coach **Gary Gilmore** earned his 700th career win in a 10-2 victory over UNC Asheville May 12. Gilmore has a 714-365 record in his 19th season as a head coach. He also has a 461-263 record in his 13th season at Coastal. He earned his 400th win at Coastal May 12, 2006 at Radford and has helped Coastal to 40-win seasons seven of the last nine years and six NCAA regionals. Gilmore is one of only 39 active coaches in Division I baseball who have 700 wins.

Coastal enjoyed national success in 2007, as the Chanticleers hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time in school history and won 50 games for the second time in three seasons. Coastal won both the Big South Conference regular-season and tournament titles for the second time in six years, going 4-0 in the BSC Tournament and defeating Liberty 6-5 in the championship game. The Chanticleers had a 16-game winning streak in the middle of the season and the 13 losses were the fewest in Gilmore's 12 seasons in Conway. Gilmore was named the Midseason Coach of the Year by *Baseball America* and earned his fourth Big South Coach of the Year honor. He earned his 700th career win May 12 against UNC Asheville. Coastal hosted the 2007 Myrtle Beach Regional and its game against Clemson brought out 6,231 fans, a BB&T Coastal Field record. Bobby Gagg and David Sappelt earned All-America honors by *Collegiate Baseball*, while Sappelt was the Big South Player of the Year, Gagg was the Pitcher of the Year and Tommy Baldrige was the BSC Tournament Most Valuable Player. CCU ended the season ranked 20th by *Baseball America*. Gilmore also received a new contract in late June, keeping him as the head coach at CCU through at least 2015, including performance incentives and raises through the term of the contract. It will also provide increases in the Coastal baseball operating budget during that time.

In his 18 seasons as a college head coach, Gilmore's
