**You Want A Piece O' Me?!** Coastal Carolina's football team hits the road in Big South Conference play, traveling to Liberty for the second of three consecutive league contests. The brief series is tied at one win each, with the home team earning the victory both times. Last season, Coastal took a 33-6 home victory over the Flames at Brooks Stadium.

**It's Not You, It's Me:** Coastal Carolina-Head Coach **David Bennett** (Presbyterian, '84) is in his third season at Coastal with a 21-7 record at CCU and 84-24 overall in nine-plus seasons. At Catawba, he led the Indians to three consecutive appearances in the NCAA Division II playoffs, including a run into the national semifinal round in 2001.

Liberty Head Coach **Ken Karcher** (Tulane, '86) is in his sixth season as head coach of the Flames, posting a 21-42 mark at Liberty and overall.

**Festivus For the Rest of Us:** Out of 28 games in its history, Coastal Carolina has played 15 under the lights. At night, the Chanticleers are an impressive 12-3, including a 9-2 mark at Brooks Stadium. Coastal is also 9-4 in day games, but the numbers continue on the road, as CCU is 6-3 in day games away from Conway.

**The Airing of the Grievances:** Coastal Carolina's football team was on television for the second consecutive game against Gardner-Webb and that has been good for the Chants. In its brief history, CCU is a stellar 8-0 in television appearances, including the dramatic wins at then No. 17 South Carolina State, Oct. 1, and against Gardner-Webb, Oct. 15. Coastal will be televised one more time this season, as the Coastal-Charleston Southern season finale will be on as part of the Big South package.

**Giddyup!** Coastal has been a stellar team when scoring first, holding a 17-1 mark going into this weekend's game at Liberty. The Chants were 8-0 in 2004 when

scoring first, including a perfect 6-0 when scoring first on the road.

**OK, Let's Go, You've Got 30 Minutes:** CCU is impressive when leading at the half with an 18-1 mark. Coastal is 8-1 when leading at the half on the road, with the only loss coming at Liberty in 2003 after leading 14-7 at the intermission.

**I'm Out There Baby And I'm Loving It!:** Coastal has played 25 of its 28 games in its history on natural grass. CCU is 20-5 on natural grass, with its only games on artificial turf at Liberty in 2003 in a tough loss, the 2004 season opening win at Morehead State, and an early season loss at Appalachian State.

**Where Are People? Show Me People!:** Coastal has been one of the standouts in I-AA in attendance based on capacity in its first two seasons. Ranking in the top seven in the nation in each of the first two years, the Chanticleers set a new Brooks Stadium record in the home opening win over No. 1 James Madison, packing 8,533 fans into a stadium that seats 6,408. CCU then followed it up with the second-largest crowd in school history, as 8,267 watched Coastal defeat Delaware State, Sept. 24. CCU currently ranks third in I-AA in attendance based on capacity at 118.73 percent.

**I Want To Make A Good Entrance:** In the home opener against James Madison, Coastal Carolina revealed a new set of black home jerseys that match the road jerseys. CCU only had teal home jerseys during the first two seasons. As seen in the opener at Elon, the Chants have replaced their road jerseys in the third season, including changing the numbers on the road jerseys from teal to black. Coastal added another look at South Carolina State, debuting new teal pants with the new road jerseys. They then combined it for a new look against Gardner-Webb, putting the new black jerseys with the new teal pants for their sixth different look of the year.

**The Road Less Taken Is Less Taken For A Reason:** The 2005 slate for the Chanticleers is very different, as compared to the first two years. Coastal played the same teams in each of the first two seasons, but this year, only Savannah State remains from the non-conference opponents last season. Among the six new teams on the schedule are defending national champion James Madison out of the Atlantic 10, Appalachian State and Elon from the Southern Conference, South Carolina State and Delaware State in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) and Mansfield (PA) out of the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC).

**They're Real And They're Spectacular:** Coastal Carolina has had a flair for the dramatic in making the most of its opportunities to earn wins against two nationally-ranked opponents, along with the conference opener.

CCU has put together three fourth-quarter rallies for the history books this season. In the home opener Sept. 10 against defending national champion and current top-five James Madison, the Chanticleers came back from a 27-17 deficit, scoring 14 points in the final 5:54, including the game winner with just over 30 seconds remaining for a 31-27 victory.

To only outdo themselves, the Chants scored 14 points in the last 9:51 at then No. 17 South Carolina State, Oct. 1, to steal a dramatic 24-23 win over the host Bulldogs. In that contest, Coastal scored with just 17 seconds to play for the win.

In the most recent game, Coastal came from behind in the fourth quarter against Gardner-Webb., including driving 41 yards in the final 22 seconds. That set up a 45-yard, game-tying field goal with no time remaining to send it to overtime, where the Chanticleers eventually pulled out the 34-31 victory.

**Nobody Drives Like Me:** Coastal has not been afraid to chew up the yardage en route to putting points on the scoreboard. Of this season's 18 scoring drives, the Chanticleers have had 14 scoring drives (11 touchdowns, three field goals) of 50 yards or more, including 10 of 70-plus yards, and only two of 35 yards or less (three touchdowns, five field goals - including the overtime game winner against Gardner-Webb). Additionally, Coastal has had 10 scoring drives of nine plays or more.

The two dramatic game-winning drives have been two of the longest scoring drives of the season for the Chanticleers. Coastal moved the ball 93 yards in 11 plays over 1:44 against James Madison and then went 86 yards in 15 plays over 6:54 for the victory at South Carolina State. However in the fourth-quarter comeback against Gardner-Webb, Coastal put together back-to-back drives of more than 90 yards for scores. The first had the Chants going 91 yards in six plays for the first touchdown, and then 96 yards in 13 plays to take its first lead of the game.

**Not Bad.... Not Bad At All:** Coastal Carolina continued to climb in the national polls this week, announced Oct. 17. Coastal's highest ranking comes in *The Sports Network* Top 25 at No. 14 with 1,300 points, moving up one spot this week. The Chanticleers also moved up in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches Poll, going from 16th to 15th with 608 points. CCU is 19th in the Any Given Saturday poll, tying the team's highest ranking ever in the poll. In two other independent rankings, the Chants are 19th by *College Sports Report* and 21st according to Don Hansen's *National Weekly Football Gazette*.

**Swarm, Swarm!!:** Coastal Carolina's defense is a major reason for the solid start to the 2005 season. Currently, the Chanticleer defense ranks 14th nationally in pass efficiency defense with a rating of 101.32. CCU also ranks in the top 35 nationally in pass defense (27th, 163.83 ypg), scoring defense (33rd, 21.2 ppg) and 17th in third down defensive conversion percentage (30.7 percent). Additionally, junior linebacker Jamar Leath is tied for eighth in the nation in total tackles with 11.7 per game.

Coastal Carolina's defense was solid during the 2004 season and it showed on the national rankings, as the Chanticleers were the top team in I-AA in pass efficiency defense and turnover margin. Combining several factors for the rating, CCU had a rating of 86.79. One factor was interceptions, where Coastal has surpassed last year's total of 17 by picking off 27 passes, including a Chanticleer-record five

interceptions in the win over Savannah State, Nov. 6. Coastal also had a +2.0 turnover margin, recording 38 turnovers while only giving up 16.

**Serenity Now, Insanity Later:** No. 15 Coastal Carolina rallied twice in the final quarter, including a 41-yard drive for a game-tying field goal, and earned a thrilling 34-31 overtime victory over visiting Gardner-Webb, Oct. 15. With the win in their first-ever overtime game, Coastal extended its home winning streak to 10 games, one shy of the Big South record.

Coastal put together a season-high 444 yards, including a season-best 251 yards of rushing. Gardner-Webb was fairly balanced on the offensive end, recording 186 yards rushing and 215 yards passing for 401 yards of total offense. Each team coughed up the ball five times overall.

CCU quarterback **Tyler Thigpen** was 16-for-25 for 193 yards and two touchdowns, while adding 29 yards on the ground. Running back **Patrick Hall** led all rushers with 81 yards on 10 carries, while running back **Aundres Perkins** added 53 yards on 11 carries. Gardner-Webb was led by quarterback Nick Roberts, who was 24-for-36 for 215 yards and one touchdown, and rushed for 54 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries. Running back Jermaine Boston was also a key for the Bulldogs with 74 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries and 45 yards on seven receptions. (Complete recap is available on page 17).

**No Soup For You!:** In last year's meeting, a strong running game and big play defense were the key to Coastal Carolina's 33-6 victory over Big South Conference rival Liberty, Oct. 23, 2004 at Brooks Stadium.

Coastal's offense rolled up 326 yards on the ground and controlled the clock by the wide margin of 38:12-21:48. Fullback **Mike Tolbert** had his first collegiate 100-yard rushing game, going for 107 yards on 10 carries, including a season-best 52 yard dash, and one touchdown. Running back **Patrick Hall** finished the game with 96 yards on 17 carries and two touchdowns, while running back **Aundres Perkins** ran 11 times for 53 yards and a touchdown on the evening.

Coastal's defense was outstanding as it registered three sacks and three interceptions while limiting the potent Liberty offense to 143 yards in total offense and only seven first downs. Leading the Chanticleer's defensive effort was junior linebacker **Maurice Simpkins** who had 10 tackles, including a sack, while junior defensive back **Greg Williamson** recorded two interceptions and two pass break-ups. Junior **Brandon Carr** registered the other pick for CCU in the victory.

Liberty was led by running back Dre Barnes, who had 44 yards on 10 carries, while quarterbacks Brock Farrel and Travis Johnson combined for 12-for-22 passing for 81 yards, no touchdowns and three interceptions. Nick Vaughn led three Liberty players in double-figure tackles with 14, while C.J. Moore and Rayshawd Barkley had 13 each. (Complete recap and stats are on page 16).

**He's Got 'Jimmy Legs':** Well they are more like 'Jamie Legs' as running back **Jamie Fordham** has made the most of his playing time for Coastal this season. In the home win over Delaware State, Sept. 24, the redshirt freshman only had 12 carries for 32 yards coming into the game, but posted his first collegiate 100-yard game with 109 yards and one touchdown on 22 carries. The 22 carries are the fourth most in Coastal history, while the 109 yards rank ninth. This was also the first 100-yard rushing game of the season for the Chanticleers and sixth this season in the Big South. He currently leads Coastal with 254 yards and one touchdown on 54 carries.

### **Weekly Press Conference**

Coach Bennett will have a weekly press conference on Wednesdays at noon of game weeks. The press conferences will be held on the Hospitality Level of CCU's Brooks Stadium. Chick-Fil-A is the proud sponsor of the weekly press luncheons.

The weekly press luncheon will have a group question-and-answer session with Coach Bennett, as well as the ability to do one-on-one interviews. If you would like to speak with an individual player, please let John Martin know and we will attempt to make arrangements, based on the student-athlete's availability due to classes.

### **Credential Requests**

All media outlets that wish to cover Coastal Carolina Football games at Brooks Stadium must submit their requests for credentials in writing, either via e-mail or via fax on company letterhead, at least one week prior to the home contest, unless requesting a season pass. John Martin will then notify you if the request has been granted, so please provide a method of contact. Press credentials **WILL NOT** be issued to spouses, friends or children.

Possession of a season credential does not guarantee a seat in the HTC Media Center/Press Box seating area. To assure yourself of a seat, you must notify John Martin of your intention to cover a particular game. All seat assignments will be made on a first-come, first-served basis.

Single game press credentials can be picked up in the Coastal Carolina Athletic Media Relations Office during the week of a home contest. If credentials are requested and approved, they will only be mailed if the request is granted at least two weeks prior to game. Any credentials not picked up will be left at the will call window at the north end of the stadium.

Credentials must be worn and visible at all times, as there will be people verifying credentials. All credentials are non-transferrable. Your credential will get you access to the stadium, press box, sidelines (photographers only) and post-game interview area in the Visitors' Building south of the press box. There will be no access to either lockerroom for interviews. We also request that photographers not photograph or take video images of any injury evaluation on the field or sidelines, due to the HIPAA privacy laws.

### **Phone Lines**

Any phone lines needed for a particular game must be requested at least 72 hours prior to the game. All long-distance costs associated with the phone line are the responsibility of the media member/outlet utilizing them.

### **Internet Access**

For those with laptop computers that can automatically select an IP address, there are Internet connections available in the football press box. Please know that the University server does track all Internet usage, including in the press box, for inappropriate use.

**Well, You're the Big Look Expert:** Coastal Carolina's football program was honored with three Big South Conference weekly awards, the league office announced Oct. 17, following the Chanticleers' thrilling 34-31 overtime win in the Big South opener against Gardner-Webb this past weekend. Linebacker **Jamar Leath** was named the New Balance Big South Defensive Player of the Week, while placekicker **Josh Hoke** was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week. Defensive back **Whittmin Reese** was named as the league's Freshman of the Week.

Leath, a junior from Elon, N.C., earns his third weekly defensive honor after recording a career-best tying 15 tackles in Coastal's win over Gardner-Webb. He posted six solo stops, a half-tackle for loss, a quarterback hurry and forced a fumble on GWU's first possession of the second half, leading to a Coastal touchdown two plays later.

Hoke, a junior from Statesville, N.C., captures his fourth weekly award after helping Coastal comeback and defeat Gardner-Webb 34-31 in overtime. He tallied 10 points, was 4-of-4 on extra points and kicked a game-tying 45-yard field goal as time expired to tie the ballgame at 31-31. In overtime, Hoke nailed a 25-yarder to win the game. He also tallied three touchbacks on five kickoffs, running his season touchback mark to 17-of-28 (62.7 percent).

Reese, a freshman cornerback from Durham, N.C., posted a career-high eight tackles in just his second career start. He had five solo hits and three assisted tackles, including a half-tackle for loss, and notched a pass breakup in Coastal's overtime winning effort.

**Mind Your Pace Boy!! Chop! Chop!:** Running back **Patrick Hall** is continuing to move up the Big South career rushing charts. Currently, the senior has 1,864 career rushing yards to rank third, having just passed Eugene Goodman of Liberty with 1,769. Dre Barnes, also from Liberty, is the Big South career rushing leader with 3,409 yards. **Aundres Perkins** is currently seventh on the chart with 1,554 yards, just one yard behind Chris Foster of Gardner-Webb in sixth.

**Just Tell Him You Don't Want To Do The Bootleg:** Though junior quarterback **Tyler Thigpen** can handle it well and has grown in the passing game this season. With his 287-yard passing output against then No. 1 James Madison, he became the first passer in CCU history to surpass the 2,000-yard mark in his career, a mark that is currently at 2,593 yards. His 287 yards were also a personal best and school record for a single game and are the second most in the Big South this season.

**All Right, I'll Do It!:** Sophomore wide receiver **Jerome Simpson** has made an impact on the Coastal program in his first 17 collegiate games. Against No. 1 James Madison, the Reidsville, N.C. native tied a school record with 10 receptions and set a new mark with 162 receiving yards. He also had two touchdown receptions, but his most memorable catch was an acrobatic, one-handed 27-yard catch that put CCU at the JMU 13 and led to the game-winning score. He also caught the game-winning touchdown pass with 17 seconds to go in the dramatic win over then-No. 17 South Carolina State and added two touchdown receptions in the overtime win against Gardner-Webb, Oct. 15.

Simpson has already taken over on the CCU career charts as well. With his 162 yards against JMU, he moved into the top spot and now leads with 709 career receiving yards. Against JMU, he also took over the lead in receptions, a standard now at 48. He already was the career leader in touchdown receptions, a mark that currently stands at 13.

**You Got a Question, You Ask The 8-Ball:** The magic answer to the question for Coastal is 200, as the Chanticleers are now 16-0 lifetime (9-0 in 2004) when rushing for 200 yards or more in a game.

The Chanticleers had a very effective ground assault on their opponents in 2004, averaging a league best and fifth in the nation 278.0 rushing yards per contest. Coastal broken the Big South single-season rushing total with 3,058 rushing yards, surpassing Liberty's 2,614 yards last season.

**I'm Putting It In The Vault:** Or on the scoreboard in this case, as coaches often say that red zone execution is a key to success for a football team. Coastal Carolina follows that philosophy. Through the first six games in 2005, the Chanticleers are 17-for-20 (85.0 percent) in the red zone (11 touchdowns, six field goals) while opponents have been limited to just 75.0 percent (18-for-24).

**How Could Anyone Not Like Him?:** And like him the Coastal faithful do, as CCU Head Coach **David Bennett** has continued where he left off at Catawba. Bennett had gone 34-5 his final three seasons at Catawba, making him now 55-12 in his last 67d games as a head coach.

**Welcome Back To The Show:** All five Big South schools are in action this week, including Coastal traveling to Liberty. Additionally, Gardner-Webb heads to VMI for a Big South TV package game, while Charleston Southern hosts Savannah State.

**The Question Is... Are You Still Master of Your Domain:** Coastal has been solid at Brooks Stadium in the first two seasons overall, posting a 12-3 mark in Conway. Last season, the Chanticleers were a perfect 7-0 at home, including winning two Big South Conference games to capture the league title. Coastal now has a 10-game home winning streak.

**Your Boys Should Stay In Their Neighborhood:** Coastal Carolina won its 10-straight home game, Oct. 15, with its thrilling 34-31 overtime win over Gardner-Webb. In that span, the Chanticleers have scored 411 points, for an average of 41.1 per game. They have held their opponents to 179 points, or 17.9 per contest during the streak. The Big South record for consecutive home wins is 11, set by Gardner-Webb from August 31, 2002 to Nov. 15, 2003.

**Here's To Feeling Good All The Time:** On this week's injury report for the game against Liberty, **Sam Harper** (right achilles strain), **Jamar Leath** (left ankle), **D.J. Rice**, (right wrist), **Santini Washington** (concussion), **Tony Williams** (shoulder separation) and **Travis Williamson** (left shoulder) are probable. **Brian Kepple** (left shoulder), **Mike Tolbert** (right shoulder) and **Antwon Trice** (right ankle) are questionable, while **Ben Hampton** (high ankle sprain) is doubtful. **Perry Helton** (left wrist) is out for the contest. Out for the season are **Jermaine Clemons** (left knee), **Keith Cox** (left knee), **Anthony Featherstone** (left knee), **Sean Lundy** (right knee), **Allen Parker** (right foot) and **James Sims** (right knee).

**Not That There's Anything Wrong With That:** Through the first two seasons, the running game was the staple of the Chanticleers, including ranking fifth in the nation in rushing offense in 2004. However in 2005, the passing game has stepped up. CCU is averaging 153.3 yards through the air, including a school-record 287 yards in the home win over defending national champion James Madison. Quarterback **Tyler Thigpen** has completed 55.3 percent (83-of-150) of his pass attempts on the year.

**You Yada Yada'd The Best Part:** Coastal Carolina continued to make national headlines with its victory over James Madison, Sept. 10. On the Sept. 13 night broadcast of ESPN Sportscenter, the 27-yard, one-handed completion from **Tyler Thigpen** to **Jerome Simpson** was named the No. 1 play on the Top 10 Plays list, another first for the school and the Big South Conference in football. It was also featured during ESPN's "First and 10" and on Chris Berman's "Top 10 Plays of the Week".

**Alright, That's It For Me, You've Been Great!:** And the big look came in the form of weekly awards for Coastal after the dramatic 24-23 win at then No. 17 South Carolina State. CCU's football program was honored with three Big South Conference weekly awards, the league office announced Oct. 3. Quarterback **Tyler Thigpen** was named the Choice Hotels Big South Co-Offensive Player of the Week and placekicker **Josh Hoke** was selected as Special Teams Player of the Week. Defensive lineman **Warren Jennings** was named as the league's Freshman of the Week.

Thigpen, who shared the honor with VMI's Jonathan Wilson, led the Chanticleers back from a 13-point deficit at No. 17 South Carolina State. He totaled 143 yards of total offense, including 46 on the ground with a long run of 22 yards, while leading CCU to two fourth-quarter touchdown drives to win the game. Thigpen directed the Chants to a 15-play, 86-yard touchdown drive in 6:54, hooking up with wide receiver **Jerome Simpson** for a three-yard score on fourth-and-goal with 17 seconds remaining. During that drive, Thigpen was 3-of-4 passing for 31 yards and also rushed for 16 yards. This is the second time this season, and third time in his career, that Thigpen has garnered the weekly honor, as he was part of the CCU Offense that earned the award for the James Madison victory, Sept. 10.

Hoke, a junior from Statesville, N.C., earns his third weekly honor of the season and seventh of his career after his 3-3 PAT performance and 39-yard field goal at South Carolina State. Last week's National Special Teams Player of Week according to Don Hansen's *National Weekly Football Gazette*, he became the first kicker in Big South history to record 100 PATs and did so with the game-winning point, hitting a PAT with 17 seconds to play. His second PAT kick was not easy, as Hoke was forced to hesitate due to a bad snap, but still managed a successful attempt. He also posted two touchbacks on kickoffs, and limited the Bulldogs' kickoff returners, who were averaging more than 46 yards a return, to just 20 yards per return.

Jennings, a freshman from Orangeburg, S.C., returned to his hometown and recorded four tackles in Coastal's 24-23 win over South Carolina State. He totaled three solo hits, as well as his first career tackle-for-loss and sack for an eight-yard loss. Jennings also recovered a fumble in the first quarter that led to CCU's first score of the game.

**Setting A Big South Defensive Record:** Coastal Carolina held Liberty to 143 total yards, Oct. 23, 2004 which set a new record for a Big South game. The previous low was 178 yards by Charleston Southern against Elon during the 2002 season.

**They Say (Radio) Networking Is Every-thing:** Coastal Carolina University's Chanticleer Sports Network continues its growth in 2005. Coastal Carolina University has joined forces with Cumulus Broadcasting and "The Team" 93.9 FM, 93.7 FM, and 1050 AM, the Grand Strand's only sports radio stations to deliver unprecedented coverage of the Chanticleers.

Adding to the Chanticleers' local coverage are network affiliates scheduled to clear all football broadcasts. With those affiliates, fans can hear **TOUCHDOWN COASTAL CAROLINA!!** across South Carolina's Coastal Plains from Columbia to Conway.

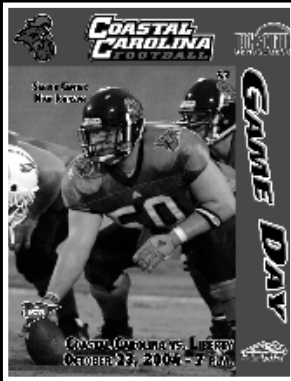

Mike Tolbert posted his first collegiate 100-yard rushing game, going for 107 yards and one touchdown on 10 carries.

A strong running game and big play defense were the key to Coastal Carolina's 33-6 victory over Big South Conference rival Liberty, Oct. 23, at Brooks Stadium.

After a scoreless first quarter, Coastal's sophomore running back Aundres Perkins opened the scoring with a two-yard touchdown run less than two minutes into the second quarter, capping off a 14-play, 62-yard drive. The extra point was missed to the right, leaving the Chanticleers with a 6-0 lead.

Patrick Hall followed it up on Coastal's next drive with the first of his two touchdowns on a 13-yard gallop. The drive was the second of four CCU scoring drives of 60 yards or more, this time a nine-play, 75-yard drive. When the two-point attempt failed, Coastal led 12-0 with 7:35, a score that held until intermission.

On Coastal's opening drive of the second half, freshman fullback Mike Tolbert added to the lead, scoring one yard out with sophomore Josh Hoke's extra point making it 19-0 Coastal with just less than five minutes into the third quarter.

Hall scored his second touchdown of the evening on a nine-yard run early in the fourth quarter, with the conversion pushing the lead to 26-0. CCU junior running back Carl Robinson scored his first touchdown as a Chanticleer with six-yard run to put the Chanticleers up 33-0 with 7:51 to play.

Liberty would get on the scoreboard on the ensuing kickoff, as senior Sam Gado took it a Liberty-record 97 yards for a touchdown to put Liberty on the board at 33-6.

Coastal's defense was outstanding as it registered three sacks and three interceptions while limiting the potent Liberty offense to 143 yards in total offense and only seven first downs. Leading the Chanticleer's defensive effort was junior linebacker Maurice Simpkins who had 10 tackles, including a sack, while junior defensive back Greg Williamson who recorded two interceptions and two pass break-ups. Junior Brandon Carr registered the other pick for CCU in the victory.

Coastal offensive rolled up 326 yards on the ground and controlled the clock by the wide margin of 38:12-21:48. Tolbert had his first collegiate 100-yard rushing game, going for 107 yards on 10 carries, including a season-best 52 yard dash, and one touchdown. Hall finished the game with 96 yards on 17 carries and two touchdowns, while Perkins ran 11 times for 53 yards and a touchdown on the evening.

Liberty was led by running back Dre Barnes, who had 44 yards on 10 carries, while quarterbacks Brock Farrel and Travis Johnson combined for 12-for-22 passing for 81 yards, no touchdowns and three interceptions. Nick Vaughn led three Liberty players in double-figure tackles with 14, while C.J. Moore and Rayshawd Barkley had 13 each.

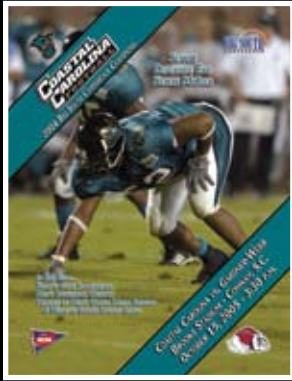

No. 15 Coastal Carolina rallied twice in the final quarter, including a 41-yard drive for a game-tying field goal, and earned a thrilling 34-31 overtime victory over visiting Gardner-Webb, Oct. 15. With the win in their first-ever overtime game, Coastal extended its home winning streak to 10 games, one shy of the Big South record.

The Chanticleers fell behind early as Kory Alston sprinted by the CCU defense for a 51-yard touchdown run and a 7-0 Gardner-Webb lead with 7:52 to go in the first quarter. The drive was 67 yards in five plays in just 1:41.

Coastal responded early in the second, converting a Bulldog fumble into its first points of the game. The Chants marched in from 44 yards out in four plays, with running back Aundres Perkins running over a GWU defender for a four-yard touchdown run to knot the game at seven.

The Bulldogs then ratted off the next 10 points of the game. Hunter Smith hit a 24-yard field goal with 3:39 to play in the first half. Then with just 14 seconds to go until intermission, quarterback Nick Roberts dove in from one yard out to cap a seven-play, 46-yard drive to put GWU up 17-7 at the break.

CCU came out and created its own opportunity to start the second half, forcing a Gardner-Webb turnover to start at the GWU 25-yard line. Two plays later, quarterback Tyler Thigpen connected with wide receiver Jerome Simpson for a 23-yard touchdown pass to cut the margin to 17-14.

Gardner-Webb built the lead back to 10, marching down the field 63 yards in seven plays over 2:53. Jermaine Boston rushed in from two yards out and the Bulldogs led 24-14 with 2:05 to go in the third quarter.

The fourth-quarter drama started early in the period, as the Chanticleers motored 91 yards in just six plays. Thigpen and Simpson connecting a second time, this time from 30 yards out, as CCU trailed 24-21 with 14:53 to go in regulation.

In the next possession, Coastal went from even deeper in its own territory, starting at its own four-yard line. It took the

Chanticleers 13 plays to go 96 yards, with Perkins covering the final seven for his second touchdown of the contest, and Coastal had its first lead of the game, 28-24, with 7:57 to play.

After trading possessions, the Bulldogs mounted a late drive of their own, going 64 yards in nine plays. Roberts hooked up with Duvaughn Flagler for a six-yard touchdown and GWU led 31-28 with 27.7 seconds to play.

More dramatics ensued for the Chanticleers, with Coastal getting the ball on 31-yard line with 22.7 seconds to play. CCU found a way to work it 41 yards down to the Gardner-Webb 28. Josh Hoke then hit a 45-yard field goal with no time remaining on the clock to tie the game at 31 and send it to overtime.

Coastal won the flip and went on defense first. Gardner-Webb started at the CCU 25 and had it down to the 14, when, on second down, linebacker Anthony Steele picked off Roberts to end the Bulldogs' drive.

The Chanticleers then started their possession on the GWU 25 and got it down to the Bulldogs' seven yard line in three plays. After another play put the ball in the middle of the field, Hoke strolled on to the field and drilled it through the uprights from 25-yards out and Coastal came out with the thrilling victory.

Coastal put together a season-high 444 yards, including a season-best 251 yards of rushing. Gardner-Webb was fairly balanced, on the offensive end, recording 186 yards rushing and 215 yards passing for 401 yards of total offense. Each team coughed up the ball five times overall.

CCU's Thigpen was 16-for-25 for 193 yards and two touchdowns, while adding 29 yards on the ground. Running back Patrick Hall led all rushers with 81 yards on 10 carries, while Perkins added 53 yards on 11 carries. Gardner-Webb was led by Roberts, who was 24-for-36 for 215 yards and one touchdown, and rushed for 54 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries. Boston was also a key for the Bulldogs with 74 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries and 45 yards on seven receptions.

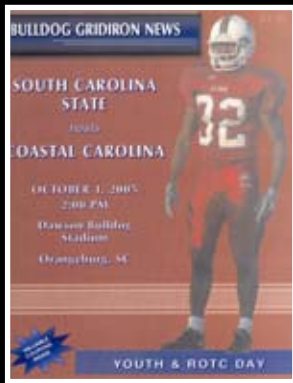

Coastal Carolina came back from a 13-point deficit in the fourth quarter for a dramatic 24-23 win at No. 17 South Carolina State, Oct. 1. CCU picked up its second win over a ranked team this season, also having defeated then No. 1 James Madison in Week 2.

Coastal forced a South Carolina State turnover on the Bulldogs' first drive of the game and capitalized on it. CCU drove 29 yards and punched it in on fourth down from the one, as fullback Mike Tolbert dove in for a 7-0 Chanticleer lead.

CCU then created another turnover, blocking SCSU's punt attempt on the next drive. Coastal was able to convert it on a Josh Hoke 39-yard field goal for a 10-0 lead with 4:33 to go in the first quarter.

After blocking a CCU field goal attempt, S.C. State drove the ball 72 yards down the field over the next 9:02 and made it count, hitting a 25-yard field goal by Stephen Grantham to cut Coastal's lead to 10-3 with 5:50 to go in the half.

The Bulldogs knotted the game with another long drive late in the first half. SCSU went 67 yards in eight plays over 2:55, capped off by Jonathan Woods' one-yard run, and the game was tied at 10 going into the intermission.

S.C. State came out and made the most of a Coastal's miscue on the opening drive of the second half. After picking off a Coastal pass and starting at the CCU 34, the Bulldogs marched down the field, with Woods eventually punching it in from one yard out for a 16-10 SCSU lead. However, Coastal's Adrain Grady blocked the extra point and the margin was remained six.

The Bulldogs again made a move down the field, scoring on a two-yard touchdown run by Woods, his third of the

afternoon. The extra point made it 23-10 SCSU with 4:32 to go in the third quarter. The big play on the drive was a 52-yard pass completion from quarterback Cleveland McCoy to wide receiver Rondreikas Darby to put SCSU in business at the Coastal 22.

Coastal fought back and cut into the Bulldog lead with a six-play, 51-yard drive, capped off by running back Aundres Perkins' three-yard run. Hoke's extra point cut the SCSU lead to 23-17 with 9:51 to play in the game.

The Chanticleers made it a flair for the dramatic again this season, taking the ball on their own 14 with 7:11 to go in the game. Coastal marched 83 yards in 14 plays and faced fourth-and-goal at the SCSU 3. Quarterback Tyler Thigpen dropped back and lofted a pass in the end zone that wide receiver Jerome Simpson pulled down for the score with 17 seconds to play. Hoke's 100th career extra point, the first in Big South history to achieve the feat, gave Coastal the lead at 24-23. Coastal defensive back Quinton Teal then picked off McCoy's pass on SCSU's first play of the final drive and sealed the victory.

Coastal was outgained by South Carolina State, 357-281, though CCU held the time of possession advantage, 31:55 to 28:05, and was 3-for-4 on fourth down conversions. The Chanticleers did put together 184 yards of rushing, led by running back Jamie Fordham with 62 yards, while Thigpen and Tolbert had 46 and 44 yards respectively. Thigpen was also 14-for-28 for 97 yards, one touchdown and one interception, including 3-for-4 for 31 yards on the final drive.

The Bulldogs had 223 yards of rushing, led by De-Shawn Baker's 92 yards on 18 carries, while Woods had 73 and three touchdowns on 15 tries. McCoy was 11-for-16 through the air for 134 yards and one interception.

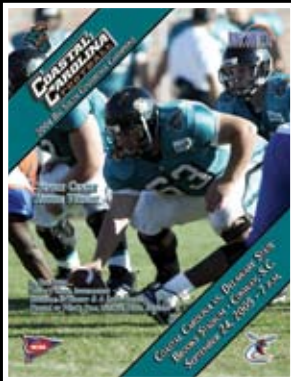

Coastal Carolina fought through a tough battle with visiting Delaware State for a 24-6 victory at Brooks Stadium, Sept. 24. With its ninth consecutive home victory, the Chanticleers moved to 3-1 on the season, while the Hornets dropped to 2-2.

The Chanticleers got on the board first, as kicker Josh Hoke hit a school-record 49-yard field goal for a 3-0 CCU lead. Coastal was set up by a defensive stand on the first drive, giving CCU the ball on its own 39. The Chants then went 33 yards in six plays over 2:15 for the score.

Delaware State got on the scoreboard late in the first quarter. After a Coastal fumble, the Hornets converted on a 37-yard field goal attempt by Erik Contos and knotted the game at three.

DSU then took the lead, again taking advantage of a CCU turnover deep in Chanticleer territory. However, the Coastal defense made a stand inside its own five yard line, forcing Contos to make a 20-yard field goal and put Delaware State up 6-3 with 7:01 to play in the half.

Coastal marched down the field, going five plays and 78 yards over 50 seconds to re-take the lead 9-6 with 6:06 to go in the half. Running back Jamie Fordham was key on the drive, with three carries for 40 yards, including plunging in from one yard out for his first collegiate touchdown. Coastal then took advantage on the extra point, catching DSU with a two-point conversion pass from holder Rob Williams to running back Aundres Perkins split out wide right to make it 11-6 Chanticleers.

CCU continued on the offensive end, this time taking advantage of a CCU defense takeaway. Hoke hit his second field goal of the game, this time from 26 yards

out, and the Chants were up 14-6 with 3:11 to go until intermission.

The Chants continued to add to their lead on their first drive of the second half. Coastal was able to get to DSU's 29-yard line before the drive stalled. Hoke came on for his second 40-plus field goal of the night, this time from 46, and CCU led 17-6 with 9:45 to go in the third quarter.

Coastal extended its lead over Delaware State early in the fourth quarter. The Chanticleers marched down the field, going 64 yards in five plays, capped off by Perkins' first touchdown of the night on a three-yard rush. The key play on the drive was 43-yard completion from quarterback Tyler Thigpen to wide receiver Darnell Williams, putting CCU at the DSU 18-yard line. Hoke's extra point put CCU up 24-6 with 11:47 to go in the contest.

DSU forced five Coastal turnovers, but the CCU defense was a difference maker. The Hornets were limited to just six points and 190 yards of total offense, while CCU churned out 297 total yards, 213 of them on the ground. Coastal is now 15-0 when rushing for more than 200 yards in a game. The game was also marred by penalties, as DSU was penalized 17 times for 144 yards and Coastal had seven penalties for 68 yards.

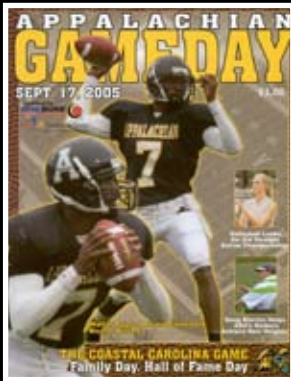
Coastal was led by Fordham, who posted his first collegiate 100-yard rushing game with 109 yards and one touchdown on 22 carries. Thigpen had nine carries for 50 yards, while going 7-for-17 for 84 yards through the air.

Delaware State was led by quarterback Vashon Winton with 45 yards on 12 carries and was 15-for-33 for 93 yards and three interceptions. Wide receiver Shaheer McBride had six catches for 41 yards.

No. 15/17 Coastal Carolina never got on track, as Appalachian State took control of the game early, as the Mountaineers won their home opener, 30-3, Sept. 17. With the win ASU moves to 2-1 on the season, while the Chanticleers fall to 2-1.

The Mountaineers got on the board first midway through the second quarter. On ASU's third possession, running back Kevin Richardson took the ball on the first play, cut back against the defense and scampered 59 yards for a 7-0 Appalachian State lead.

Appalachian struck again, this time on the defensive side. Quarterback Tyler Thigpen overthrew the Coastal receiver and Corey Lynch picked it off at the ASU 25. Lynch then returned it 41 yards, where he fumbled it but Jason Hunter recovered it and took it the final 25 yards for a Mountaineer score. The extra point hit the right upright and Appalachian State led 13-0 with 10 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

ASU continued to move the ball in the second quarter and moved down to the Coastal one-yard line with a first down. However, the Chanticleer defense toughened and limited the Mountaineers to a 19-yard Julian Rauch field goal, and ASU led 16-0 with 8:06 left in the second quarter.

Richardson got in the end zone again for Appalachian, this time on an 18-yard touchdown run to put the Mountaineers up 23-0. The run capped a 10-play, 79-yard drive over 4:04, ending with 2:59 to go in the half. ASU took advantage of a 32-yard punt return to the Coastal 28-yard line. Quarterback Richie Williams connected with tight end Daniel Bettis on a 23-yard completion to the CCU 5, and Richardson took it in on the next play to give ASU a 30-0 halftime lead.

Coastal got the ball first in the second half and put together a sustained drive resulting in its first score of the game. Kicker Josh Hoke wrapped up the 11-play, 70-yard drive with a 27-yard field goal to cut the advantage to 30-3 with 10:23 left in the third quarter.

The Mountaineers dominated on both sides of the ball, outgaining the Chants 582-225. Richardson had 18 rushes for 178 yards and three touchdowns, while Williams was 13-of-25 for 185 yards and had nine carries for 85 yards.

In his first game at full strength, junior Aundres Perkins had eight carries for 53 yards. Another bright spot for the Chants was junior Ren McKinnon's 125 yards on five kick returns in his first game at that position.

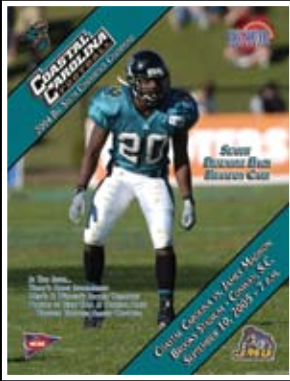

Coastal Carolina rebounded with 14 unanswered points in the final six minutes of play to shock top-ranked James Madison, 31-27, Sept. 10 at Brooks Stadium. With the victory in its first game over a ranked opponent, Coastal extended its overall winning streak to 10 games and its home win streak to eight. CCU also posted its 12th win in the last 13 games.

Coastal got on the scoreboard first, as the Chanticleers put together a nine-play, 77-yard drive midway through the first quarter. CCU scored on a 21-yard pass play from quarterback Tyler Thigpen to wide receiver Jerome Simpson to put the Chants up 7-0 with 5:53 to play in the half.

JMU came up with a response of their own three drives later, going 73 yards in 14 plays over 6:33. After a pair of quarterback sneaks were stopped at the one, running back Alvin Banks scored on a one-yard sweep over the left side to knot the game at seven with 12:11 to go in the second half.

CCU answered on the ensuing drive, marching 56 yards in 11 plays, capped off by fullback Mike Tolbert's one-yard touchdown plunge to make it 14-7 with 7:16 to go in the half. Coastal had two key plays in the drive, the first on fourth-and-one, with running back Aundres Perkins gained three yards to keep the drive alive. Three plays later, Thigpen connected with tight end Nathan Farley for an 18-yard completion to get to the JMU one.

On Coastal's next possession, JMU's Clint Kent intercepted a Thigpen pass at the CCU 38 and returned it to the 26. Three plays later, Banks scored his second touchdown of the game, this time a six-yard rush, and the Dukes tied the game at 14.

The Chants put together a late drive to close out the half, going 58 yards in 12 plays. Kicker Josh Hoke was good from 32 yards out and CCU headed into the halftime lockerroom with a 17-14 lead.

JMU continued to battle and eventually broke through late in the third. On third and five from CCU's 10, quarterback Justin Rascati just avoided the rush on a pass play and scrambled into the end zone to give the Dukes their first lead of the game at 20-17 with 3:03 to play in the period. Wantuck missed the extra

point though to keep the game within a field goal.

The Dukes took advantage of a Coastal 15-yard punt into the wind and started the drive at the CCU 43. It took them 10 plays, but JMU puffed it in the end zone, as running back Maurice Fenner dived in from the one-yard line on third down to put the defending national champions up 27-17 with 9:52 to go.

Coastal would not go quietly, as the Chanticleers came right back with a nine-play, 78-yard march over the next 3:51. Thigpen hooked up with Simpson for a 23-yard touchdown strike in the left corner of the end zone and the margin was back to three at 27-24 with 5:54 to go in the contest. It was the second touchdown of the game from Thigpen to Simpson.

After a six-play drive stalled for the Dukes, Coastal had the ball at its own seven yard line and had 2:14 to play with. Thigpen hooked up with Simpson to start the drive and get to the 14-yard line. After two incompletions, Thigpen and Simpson kept the drive alive with another seven-yard strike for first down. On third and 10 at the 21, Simpson caught a 21-yard pass to the 42 of Coastal. The two would then hook up two straight times, getting the ball to the Dukes' 13 yard line. A quarterback sneak by Thigpen put the ball at the eight, setting up the eight-yard pass to wide receiver Perry Parks, giving the Chants the 30-27 lead with just 30 seconds to play. After an 18-yard kickoff return, JMU was able to get four plays off, the last a "Hail Mary" that was knocked down at the CCU five-yard line.

CCU amassed 415 total yards, including 287 through the air. Thigpen was outstanding, going 24-for-36 for a school record 287 yards, three touchdowns and just one interception. He also led Coastal in rushing with 46 yards on 11 carries, as the Chants rushed for 128 yards in the game. Simpson had 10 receptions for a school-record 162 yards and two touchdowns.

JMU had 361 yards of total offense, spurred by 190 yards of rushing. Banks led the Dukes with 88 yards rushing and two touchdowns, while Fenner chipped in 74 and one touchdown. Rascati finished with 16-for-21 passing for 171 yards.

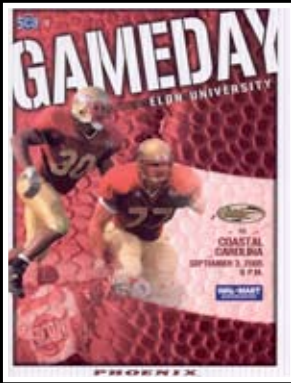

Coastal Carolina opened the 2005 football season with a tough fought 17-10 victory at Southern Conference foe Elon, Sat., Sept. 3. Coastal has now won each of its three season openers, while the Phoenix dropped their season opener.

Elon got on the scoreboard first with 3:46 to go in the first half, as sophomore quarterback Kye Hamilton connected with tight end Kyle Belkoski for a three-yard touchdown pass and a 7-0 Phoenix lead. The drive was spurred by a Hamilton 40-yard pass to wide receiver Michael Mayers that put the Phoenix at the Chants' 10-yard line, with the score coming three plays later.

Coastal fought back on the next drive, as junior Aundres Perkins plunged in from one yard to tie the game at seven with 13:56 to go in the first half. The Chanticleers drove 70 yards in 11 plays over 4:44, with the big play a 26-yard pass completion from quarterback Tyler Thigpen to wide receiver Chris Noble to put CCU at the Elon 14. Earlier on, Thigpen had connected with tight end Nathan Farley for 13 yards on a third-and-8 play to keep the drive alive.

CCU took its first lead of the season on a 30-yard field goal by junior Josh Hoke, putting the Chanticleers up 10-7 with 2:12 to play in the first half. The field goal capped a 13-play, 83-yard drive over 7:05 that started on the Coastal five-yard line.

After a scoreless third quarter, Elon started the fourth with a 33-yard field goal by Andrew Wilcox to knot the game at 10 with 14:55 to play. Elon had gone 44 yards in eight plays in 4:19, helped by two CCU penalties, including a 15-yard pass interference call on a fourth-and-one play earlier in the drive.

Later in the fourth quarter, Coastal linebacker Maurice Simpkins forced a Hamilton fumble at the Elon 33, which was scooped up by linebacker Jamar Leath and returned to the 12-yard line. Four plays later, CCU took the lead, as Perkins dove in from two yards out for his second score to put the Chanticleers up 17-10 with 8:38 to play.

The Phoenix came back immediately, as Jacobi Jones returned the ensuing kickoff 78 yards to the Coastal 15-yard line. Elon appeared to even the game on a 15-yard run by Reggie Hall that was called back on an illegal motion penalty. Three plays later, the Phoenix tried a 42-yard field goal that went wide right, and the Chanticleers maintained their seven-point lead, eventually holding on for the victory.

CCU outgained Elon in total offense, 262 to 233. Coastal was led by running back Patrick Hall, who rushed for 71 yards on 22 carries, while Thigpen was 12-for-22 for 132 yards. Elon was paced by Hall, who rushed for 74 yards on 20 carries, with Hamilton going 15-for-26 for 130 yards and one touchdown.
